In 1990, Gaston became the first Black female physician to become director of the Bureau of Primary Health Care in the U.S. Health Resources and Services Administration. She was also the second Black woman to serve as assistant surgeon general and achieve the rank of rear admiral in the U.S. Public Health Service
